Jan O'Leary if you have any queries.


A full and interesting program has been organized by your Conference Committee and I know you will not be disappointed. I look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible.

Why Changing Places toilets are so important for people with a stoma?

"I have often had to change my colostomy bag whilst kneeling on a toilet floor. This experience leaves me very upset and often very fearful of going out as my first thought would be about the toilet facilities and what they are like. I feel that there needs to be more awareness around the different people who actually need to use a disabled toilet"

**Changing Places** toilets meet the needs of people living with a stoma with a hook and shelf space in every cubicle. However, they are also important as they are challenging perceptions of what kind of people can use a 'disabled' toilet. Are we up to speed in NZ toilets.....

Is this something we as a society can assure that the councils and retailers etc know of this need?
